Doyon, Limited Supports New Fairbanks Heart Center with \$50,000 Contribution

Fairbanks, Alaska – Doyon, Limited presented a check for \$50,000 to the Greater Fairbanks Community Hospital Foundation on Oct. 6th, showing the corporation’s support for the new Harry & Sally Porter Heart Center that will be constructed in Fairbanks.

The center will house cardiology treatment and care for residents in Fairbanks and the Interior. Previously, Fairbanks Memorial Hospital opened a cardiology clinic and cardiac catheterization lab, and recruited three cardiologists to Fairbanks. The hospital projected it would see 750 patients at the clinic during the first year – that number was actually 1,500.
